## **Local Educator Selected as Emerging Leader**

ST. LOUIS, MO—Angela Walmsley, an associate professor of research methodology at Saint Louis University, has been recognized as an Emerging Leader by PDK International, a leading association of education professionals.

Prior to taking her current position, Walmsley was an information technology instructor at Trinity College in Dublin, Ireland; a mathematics teacher at a grammar school and a college in Northern Ireland; a mathematics instructor at a community college in Illinois; a teaching assistant and student teacher supervisor at Saint Louis University; and an assistant professor at Maryville University. She has also presented at local and national conferences and published in professional journals.

“While I do not work every day in K-12 schools, my leadership has impacted many schools by educating their leaders,” Walmsley said.
